
Northumberland & Durham Regional Newsletter - May 2024

Hello everyone, this is a long overdue newsletter and I plan to share a variety of resources for those researching in the two north east regions. I have also made this available to others who are interested in the regions, either those researching more generally, or those whose surnames have their origin typically in the region.

- The biggest news for us is the opening of **The Story** (https://thestorydurham.org) on 14 June 2024. This is the long-awaited Record Office for the County of Durham:
 - Comprising of 6 miles of archives, which span 900 years of local history,
 - Permanent & temporary exhibitions
 - o Durham Register Office with a wedding & civil ceremony area for 100 people
 - Archive of the Durham Light Infantry which unites the archive and object collection for the first time since 1996.

• Annual Big Meet takes place on Saturday 13
July 2024. The big meet takes place on the second Saturday in July and has been held since 1871, it is the biggest celebration of trade unions & community values - https://www.friendsofdurhamminersgala.org/ As someone from the south east of England I am fascinated with the community spirit of the mining communities, because whilst mining has left the communities and mining is no longer an employment opportunity, the spirit does live on. My husband has mining ancestors, from both here in the north-east and in Derbyshire.

One of the first heritage type visits we did when we first moved the County Durham was to visit the building known as the "Pit Parliament", this is opportunity that appears to be
