Northumberland & Durham Regional Newsletter - December 2025


This is an occasional newsletter aimed at **Guild of One-Name Studies** (https://one-name.org) members who are in the **Northumberland & Durham Regions**.

Hello everyone, this is a long overdue newsletter, and I plan to share a variety of resources for those researching in the two north east regions. I have also made this available to others who are interested in the regions, either those researching more generally, or those whose surnames have their origin typically in the region.

This is also going to be incorporated with the Guild of One-Name Studies Yorkshire regional newsletter, which also goes out to several other regions, so I hope I am forgiven for sharing again part of the May 2024 newsletter.

- The biggest news for those of us researching in County Durham was the opening of The Story (https://thestorydurham.org) on 14 June 2024. This is the long-awaited Record Office for the County of Durham:
 - o Comprising of 6 miles of archives, which span 900 years of local history,
 - Permanent & temporary exhibitions
 - Durham Register Office with a wedding & civil ceremony area for 100 people
 - Archive of the Durham Light Infantry which unites the archive and object collection for the first time since 1996.
- For 2026, an Art and Science venue, which is to be called **Light** will open in the former home of the Durham Light Infantry Museum. As far as I am aware, no actual date has been released, but this is an important element of local history, not just in the regeneration of a regional building, but also a nod to Durham University and its involvement with the James Web Space Telescope
- For those that might have missed it, the Northumberland Name Books webinar hosted by the Guild of One-Name Studies with Diana Whaley. Annual Big Meet will take place on Saturday 11 July 2026. The big meet takes place on the second Saturday in July and has been held since 1871, it is the biggest celebration of trade unions & community values - https://www.friendsofdurhamminersgala.org/ As someone from the south east of England I am fascinated with the community spirit of the mining communities, because whilst mining has left the communities and mining is no longer an employment opportunity, the spirit does live on. My husband has mining ancestors, from both here in the north-east and in Derbyshire.

One of the first heritage type visits we did when we first moved the County Durham was to visit the building known as the "**Pit Parliament**", this is opportunity that appears to be repeated each year as part of Heritage week. Having been though a period of refurbishment, the website now shows an interesting video stream of the regeneration of the region, and you can get a glimpse of the inside of the "Pit Parliament".
